

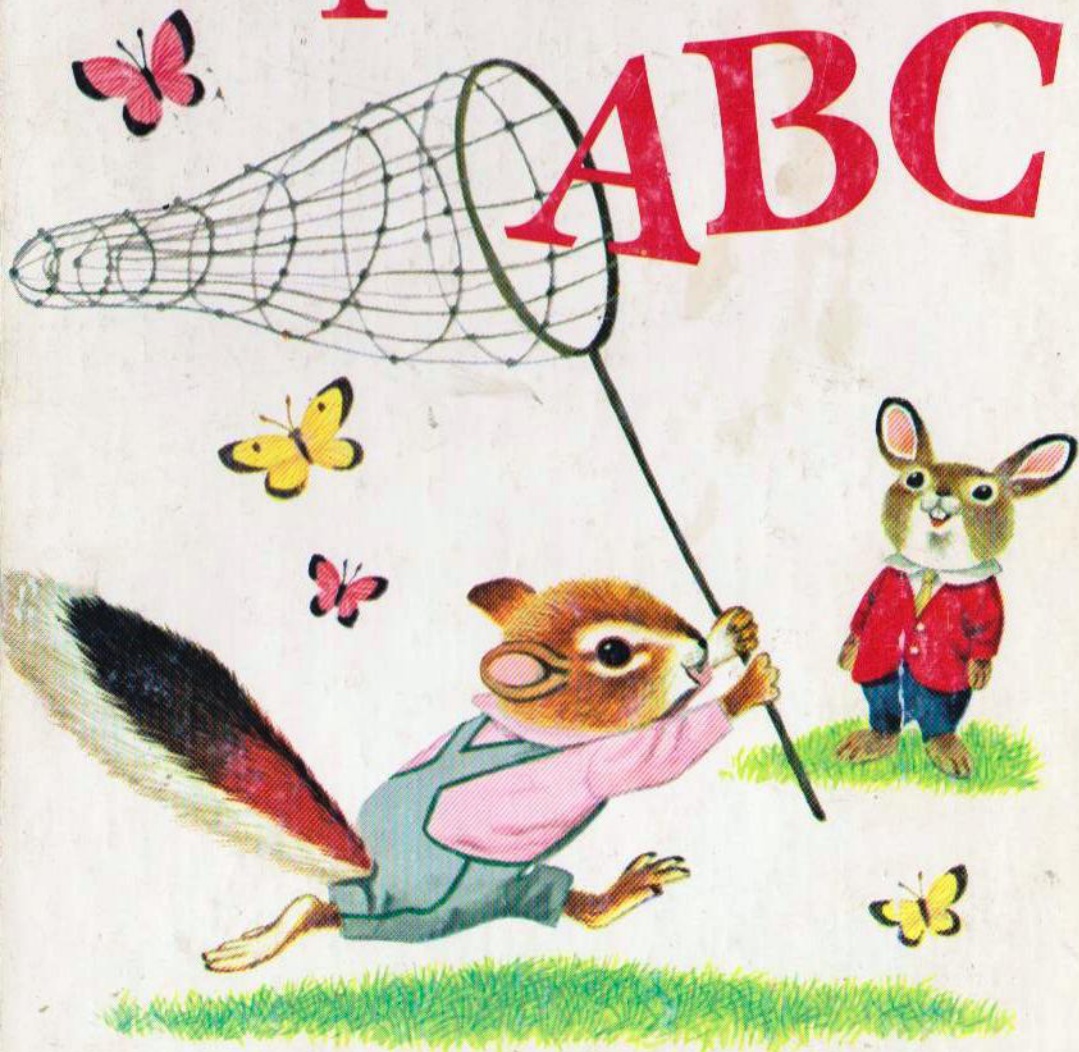

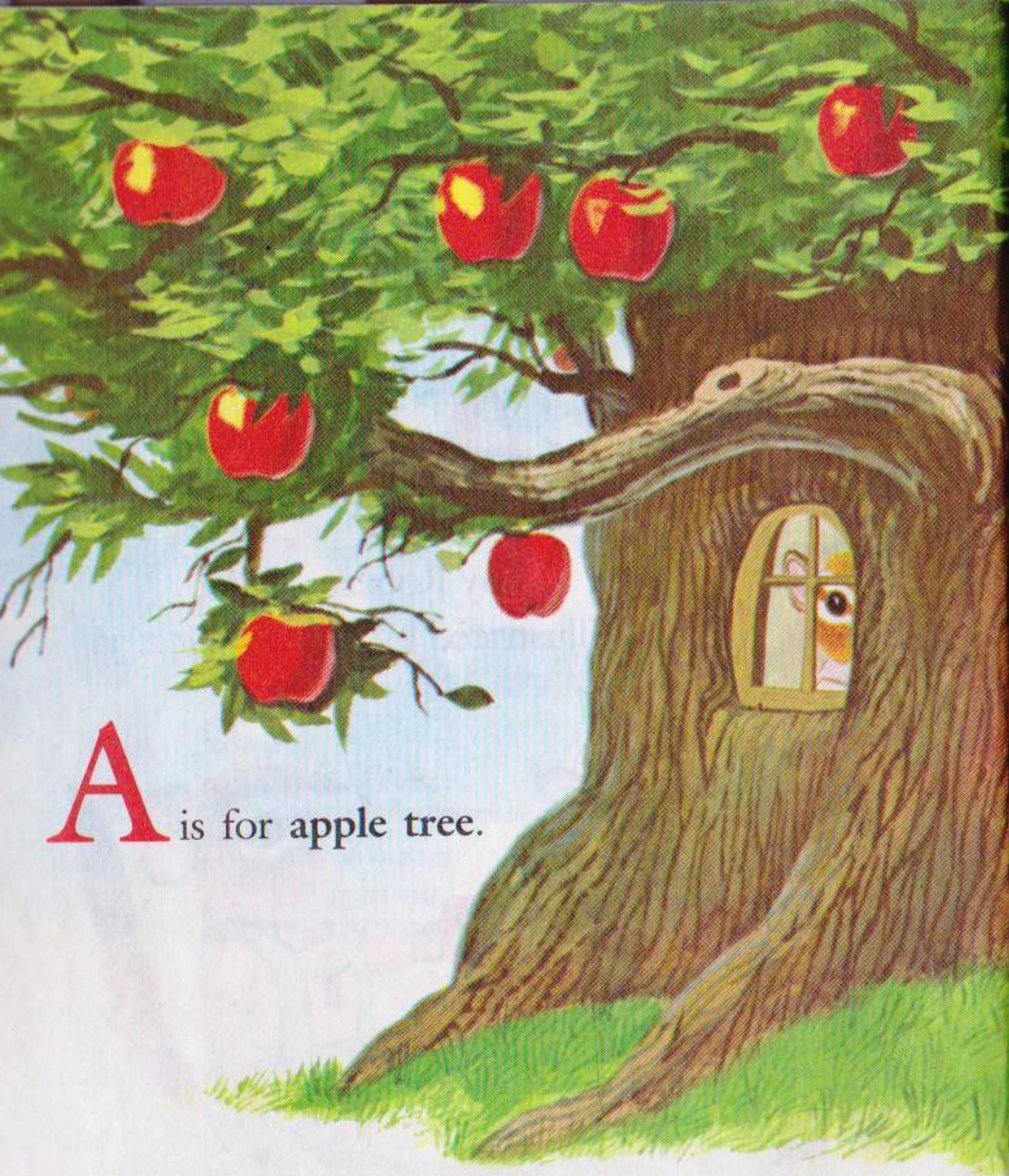

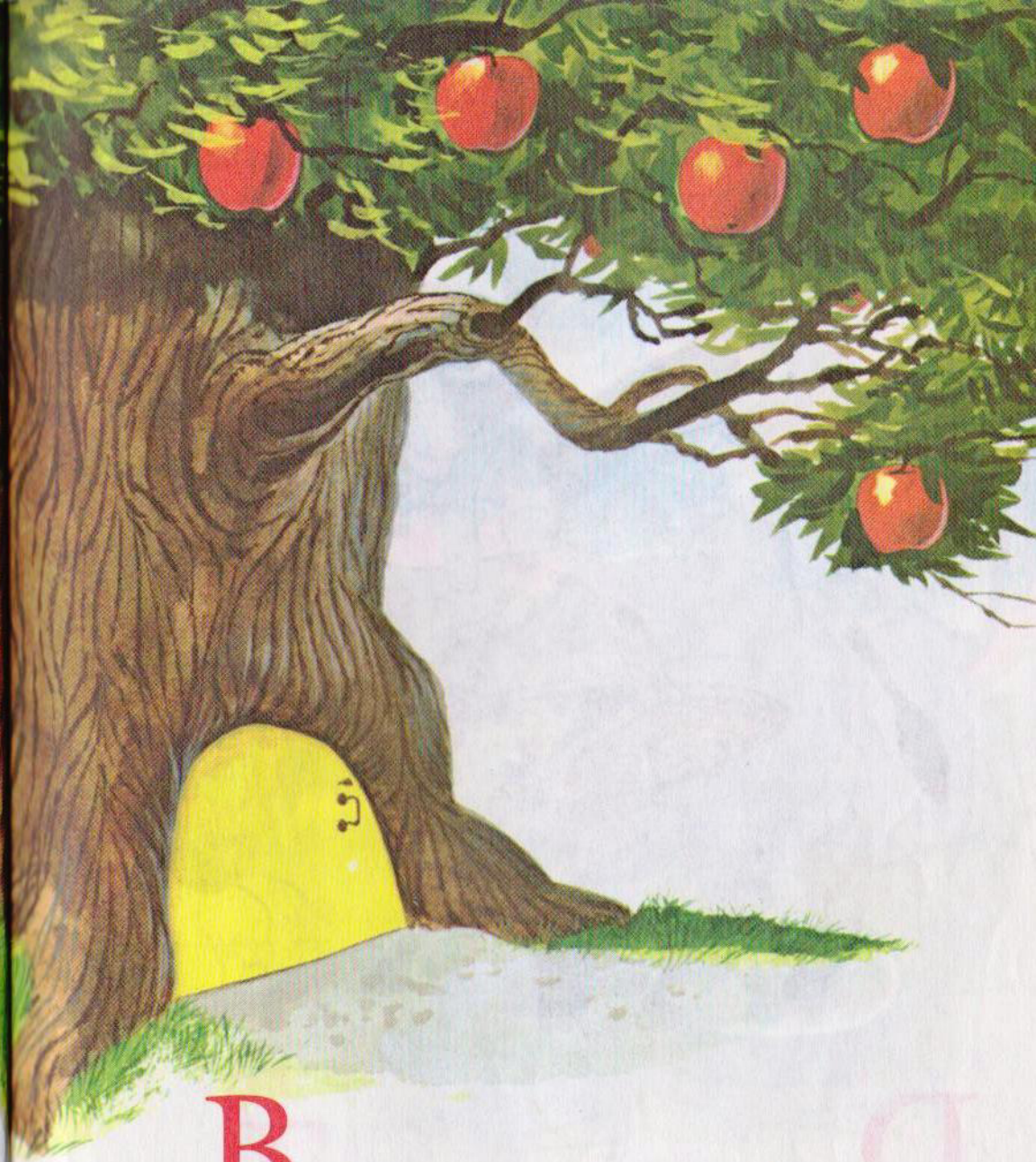

D is for **Donkey**. Chipmunk and **Donkey** have been out picking **daffodils**.

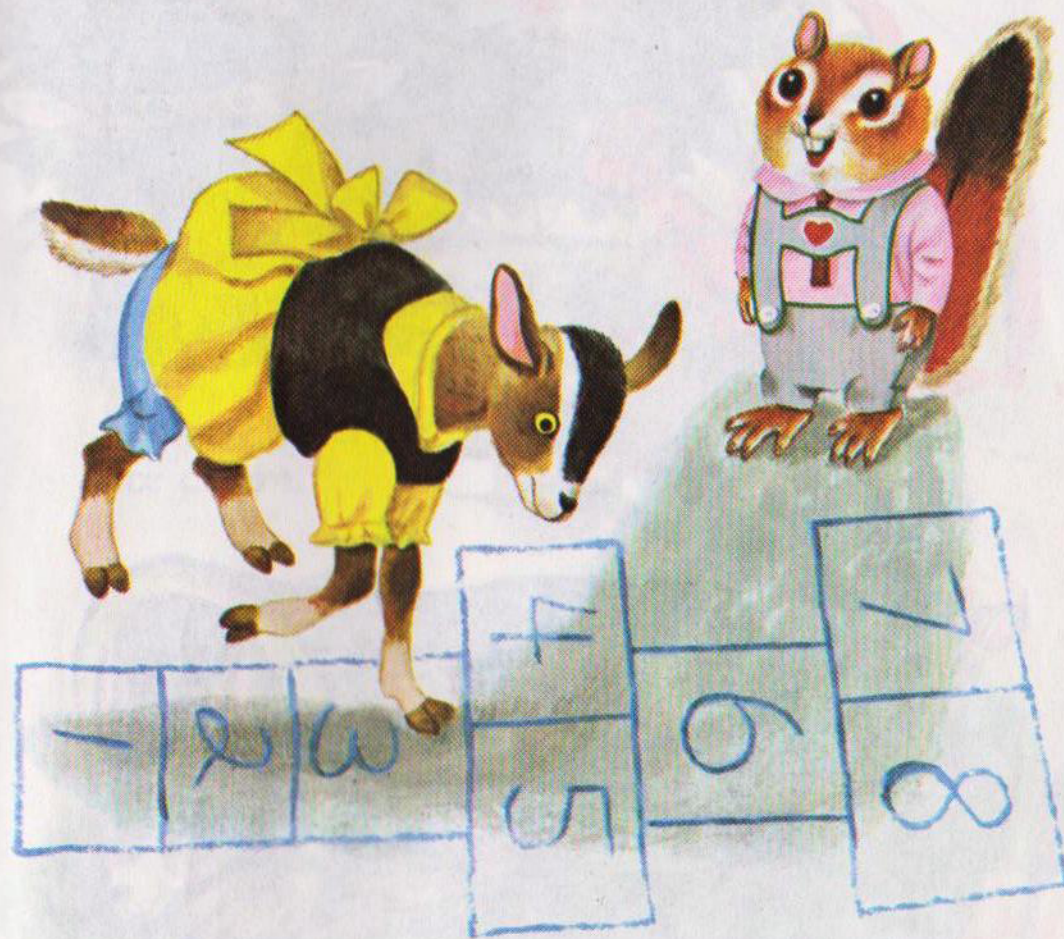


E is for **ears**. Chipmunk's mother washes his **ears**.

G is for Goat.

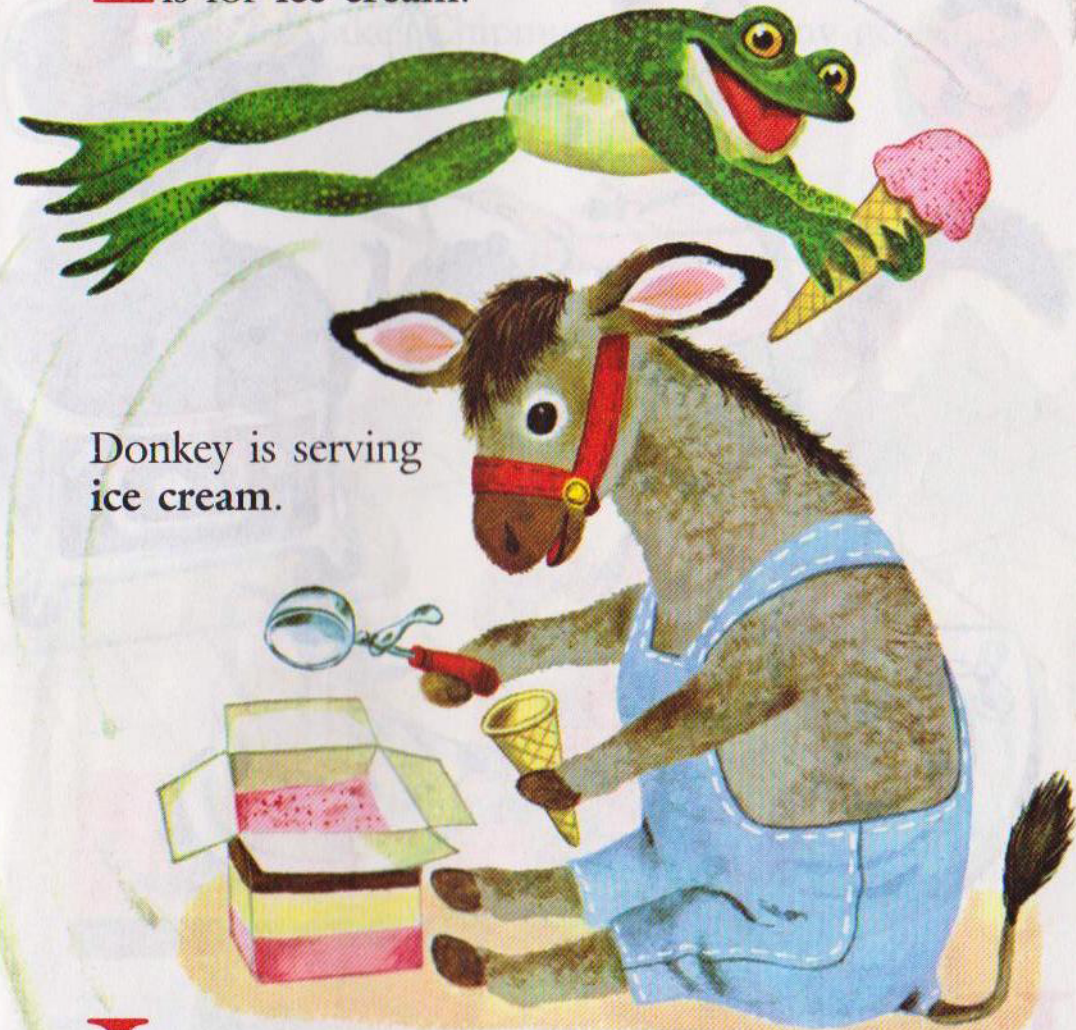


Goat plays a game with Chipmunk.

Iis for **ice cream**.



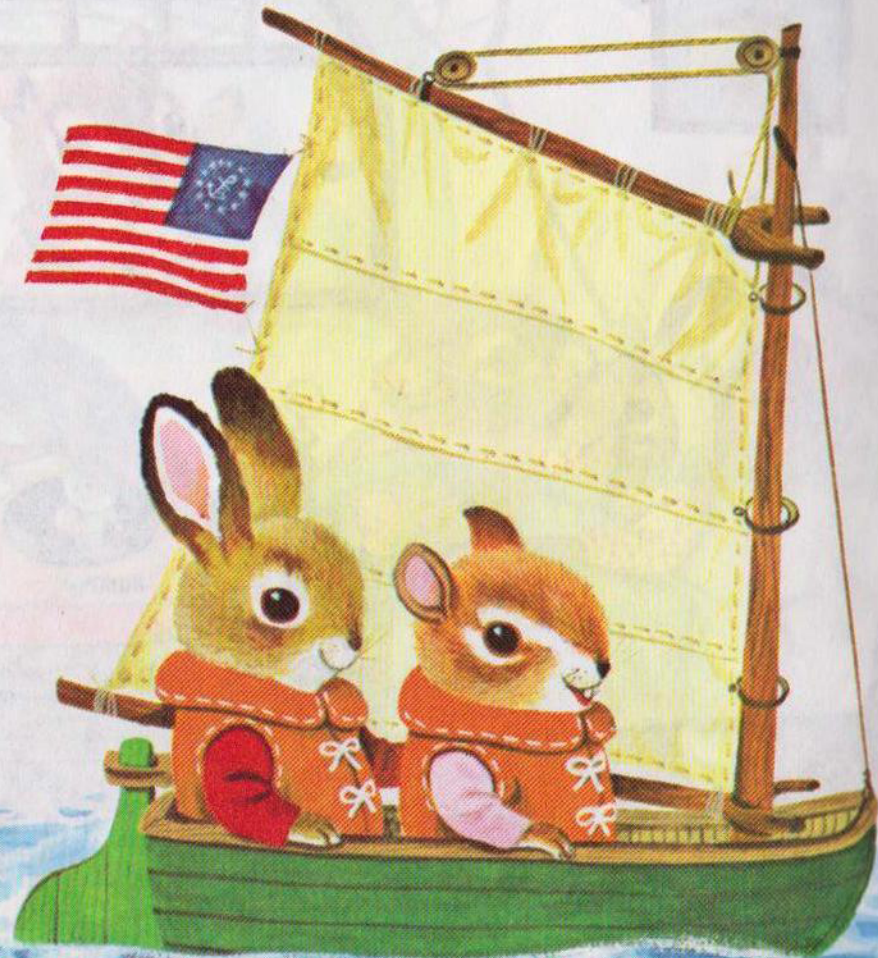
Donkey is serving

M is for **Mouse**. Mouse has **mumps**. He listens to **music** and has his **meals** in bed.

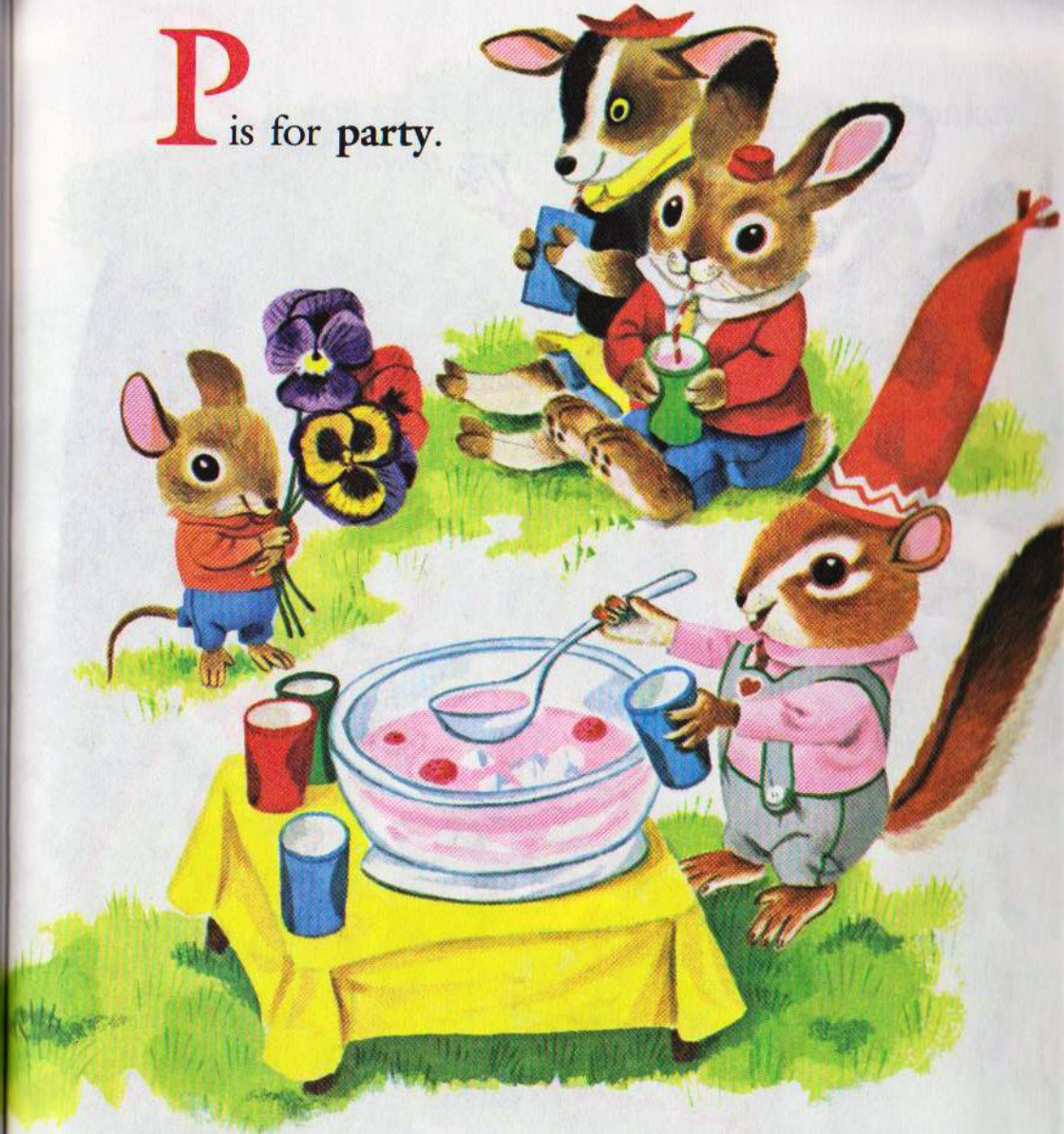


N is for **net**. Chipmunk catches butterflies in his **net**.

S is for swing.



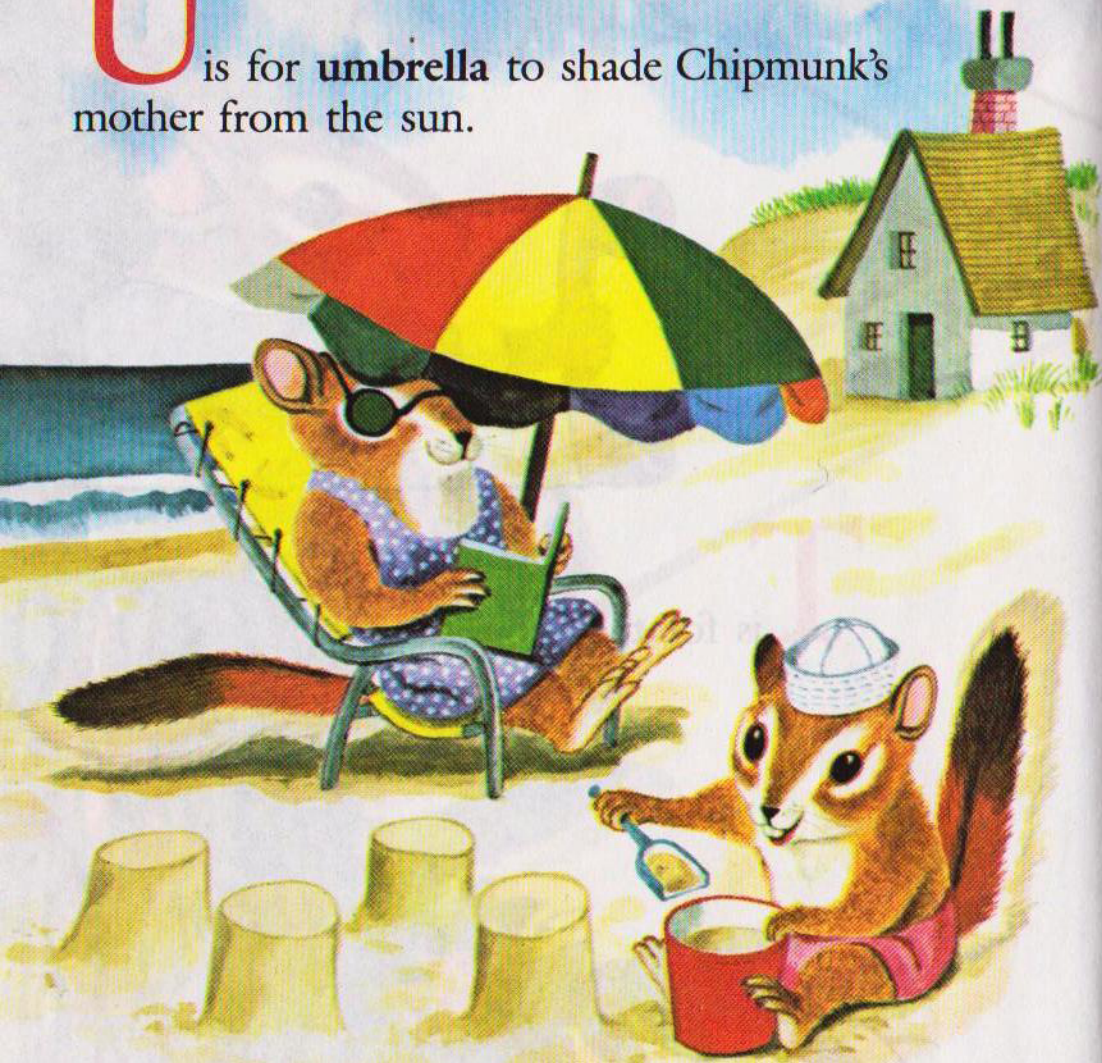
Chipmunk likes to **swing** almost as much as he likes to **swim**.

U is for **umbrella** to shade Chipmunk's mother from the sun.



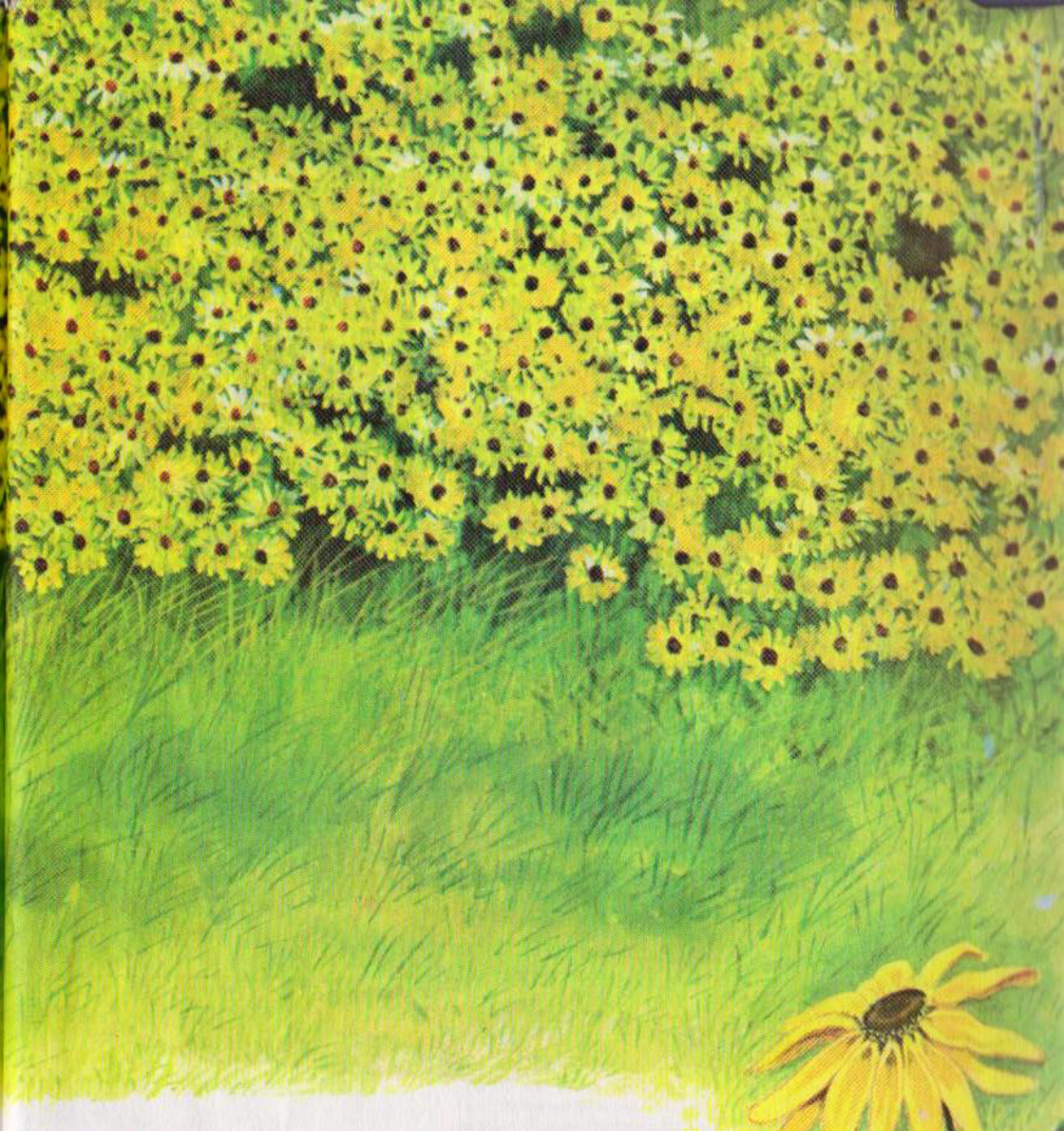
V is for **vacation**. Chipmunk and his mother are at the seashore, staying in a **villa** with a nice **view** of the sea.
